CURRENT CONSULTATIONS

- a) **Community Council Research – Survey 2018** –Scottish Community Development Centre.
Closing date: 30 May 2018
Survey on Community councils and their activities intended for all current or retired community councillors in Scotland. Answers based on their own experience rather than having to consult with their community council before completing the survey. Survey is part of wider research to explore opportunities for community councils to make a difference in the areas they represent.

- b) **Licensing Policy Statement Review** - Local Licensing Boards. **Closing date:** 31 May 2018.
Revised response circulated incorporating input from Matt Kitson and then submitted without further change.
- c) **Consultation on a new Enterprise Agency for the South of Scotland** – Scottish Government.
Closing date: 7 June 2018
In June 2017, the Scottish Government confirmed that they would create a new enterprise agency for the South of Scotland. This agency will operate in two local authority areas: Dumfries and Galloway and the Scottish Borders. It will focus on the needs of the area, driving inclusive growth, supporting communities and capitalising on people and resources.
They want to consult the public to find out more about what people want from this agency, and how it can best help the south of Scotland. As well as this written consultation document, the Government will be taking forward a range of meetings across the area over the next few months to hear views directly.
